

PRE-INSTALLATION PREPERATION


Pre-installation Inspection:

- Inspect inlet condition for breaks and deformed parts
- Rough opening in ceiling (25" L x 16" W)
- Mounting surface should be flat
- Ensure that no debris is hanging out of rough opening hole that can interfere with inlet mechanism
- Determine winch line setup layout. Refer to winch line setup diagram.

*Advanced opening opens inlet 2¼" without engaging non-advanced inlets. -350 CFM at .05 static pressure.

Winch Line Setup(s)







ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: How to engage door closer

1a: Remove closer assemblies from stowed position.






ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 2: Place inlets on floor aligned with rough size openings above and determine which inlets should en-gage Advanced Opening System(AOS).




STEP 3: For the Inlets that engage AOS, flip lever up and lock it by securing locking tab.


STEP 5: Fasten inlet to ceiling. Insert completed inlet with insulated barrier into properly sized rough opening and fasten with hardware. For ease of installation start all screws while inlet is on the floor using designated center markings.




STEP 5: In stall rod and winch lines.




STEP 4: Fasten insulation barrier on inlet. It can be






STEP 6: Take note that the nylon cable for each side is aligned and free of twists and knots.




ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 7: With winch open 16" or 3/4 stroke. Prop open lid with 9" long wood spacer to create max open.



STEP 8: Secure cord to rod using winch line clamp minimum of 18" from inlet side to ensure that clamp doesn't reach inlet when it's in the closed position. Poly cord should be taut.



Winch Line Detail



Knot should be on bottom hole. Ensure cord is free of twists.

Take note that both knots are on the same side.
